



This Sunday's Gospel

Taken from the Gospel for 2nd October 2022 (Luke 17:5-10):

The Reward of Faith

The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith." The Lord replied, "Were your faith the size of a mustard seed you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you. Which of you, with a servant ploughing or minding sheep, would say to him when he returned from the fields, 'Come and have your meal immediately?' Would he not be more likely to say, 'Get my supper laid; make yourself tidy and wait on me while I eat and drink. You can eat and drink yourself afterwards?' Must he be grateful to the servant for doing what he was told? So with you: when you have done all you have been told to do, say, 'We are merely servants: we have done no more than our duty."'



Gospel Reflection

The two sections of this Gospel reading appear at first sight to be entirely separate, the first about faith, the second about the reward of service; but they do fit together. The faith required consists not in reciting a creed but in hanging on by one's finger-tips, through thick and thin, to God's power and will to save. In nothing else is there any hope, not in my own power or ability. That is why, in the second section, we have no right to expect any sort of reward as our due from God. The value of our work in itself is secondary to our admission of helplessness and our trust in God's to save us. However, not all parables should be taken as allegories. The severe master here is not necessarily God, any more than the master who in another parable praises his crooked steward. When we hear the unyielding command of the master to the slave to expect nothing and to set about serving at supper, we cannot forget that at the Last Supper it was Jesus who put on his apron and washed his disciples' feet. We may be unworthy slaves, but Our Lord's action at the Last Supper gives us confidence that our Master ministers to us. How do I best serve God and others? Dom Henry Wansbrough OSB

Our Lady and All Saints MAC Mass of Thanksgiving and Formal Launch of the OLAAS Children's Charter



Here is Louise's story:

In 2019, I was successful in my entry into the ballot for the 2020 London Marathon. After months of training, a global pandemic scuppered my plans and the marathon was sadly cancelled. Having raised £4k for the Mind charity through the extremely generous donations of my supporters, I ran the 26.2 miles around Solihull in the Virtual London Marathon in October 2020 and got the money to the charity where it was so desperately needed. I kept my ballot place for the 2021 London Marathon but then actually caught Covid myself 6 weeks before the event and I wasn't fit enough to run.

So...this is my 3rd and final attempt to run the London Marathon in actual London!! On 2nd October 2022, I once again have the opportunity to complete the 26.2 miles. This time, I am raising money for a cause that is just as close to my heart as that of mental health. As the treasurer of our School Association (also known as PTA in some schools), I saw our fundraising reduce by around £12,000 over 2 years due to the pandemic largely because we couldn't run any events. I had many less pennies and pounds to count sadly! Although we'll never get that money back, I'd like to try and raise a little bit of money now just to make a bit of a difference.

Money raised from our fundraising activity is used to further enrich the lives and learning of our children in ways that aren't always possible through the funding that the (wonderful) school receives from government alone. The money allows us to provide tangible benefits for pupils whilst they are at school often in the form of physical and creative activity - both also close to my heart and so important for our children as they grow up in a world where educational targets are increasingly based on academic aptitude alone. At a time when money is so tight for so many people, I know that another fundraising request may be a little exasperating. However, any amount that you can give no matter how big or small would be appreciated more than you know. Literally every penny counts and will help to make a difference to the lives of our children following a time when Covid has robbed them of so much. Thank you for your time and see you (finally!) at the finish line!
