Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents and Carers,

Last week Mr Davis, the CSEL in our MAC, visited OLW school and enjoyed a complete tour of the school. He commented on how smart the children looked in their uniforms and how enthusiastic they were in answering all of his questions. He also remarked on the excellent behaviour of the children and I felt very privileged showing him around our school.

On Monday we joined other schools in the OLAAS MAC to say the rosary linked to the joyful mysteries. It was wonderful to come together as a community to pray.

Our school governors also visited this week to talk to our leaders about the various projects that they have been involved in this half term. This Sunday's Gospel

Taken from the Gospel for Sunday 15th October 2023 (Matthew 22:1-10)


An Invitation to the Wedding Feast Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people: 'The kingdom of Heaven may be compared to a king who gave a feast for his son's wedding. He sent his servants to call those who had been invited, but they would not come. Next he sent some more servants. "Tell those who have been invited," he said, "that I have my banquet all prepared, my oxen and fattened cattle have been slaughtered, everything is ready. Come to the wedding." But they were not interested: one went off to his farm, another to his business, and the rest seized his servants, maltreated them and killed them. The king was furious. He despatched his troops, destroyed those murderers and burnt their town. Then he said to his servants, "The wedding is ready; but as those who were invited proved to be unworthy, go to the crossroads in the town and invite everyone you can find to the wedding." So these servants went out onto the roads and collected together everyone they could find, bad and good alike; and the wedding hall was filled with guests. When the king came in to look at the guests he noticed one man who was not wearing a wedding garment, and said to him, "How did you get in here, my friend, without a wedding garment?" And the man was silent. Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind him hand and foot and throw him into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth." For many are called but few are chosen.'



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Gospel Reflection

A wedding is a time of joy and of completion after long preparation, a time of love and of complete satisfaction. In Judaism at the time of Jesus, the coming of the Messiah is often compared to the joy of a wedding-feast. The marriage-feast at Cana must have been some party! At Mary's request Jesus produced 900 litres of wine. The Letter to the Ephesians teaches that the love in a human wedding is only a foretaste of Christ's love for his bride, the Church. In the story of the royal wedding in this Sunday's Gospel, however, two things go drastically wrong. First, the original wedding guests refuse to come. Not only do they refuse, but they brutally maltreat the innocent messengers, and the king (who must represent God) ruthlessly burns down their city. Secondly, the man who has no wedding-garment is thrown out: a weddinggarment is a standard Jewish image for works of generosity expected of every faithful Jew. For us Christians too, the story constitutes a double warning. Are we alert and listening for God's call? Do we rest secure in being called Christians and leave the challenging jobs to others? It will also help to reduce traffic and improve safety outside school.

Online Safety Cyberbullying



Bullying is hurtful and exists online just as it does offline. Online it can take many forms such as sharing embarrassing photos, nasty comments, or dislikes. Because kids spend so much time on their devices, if they are being bullied it is hard to escape it.

Cyberbullying can happen in different ways, but some examples might be:

- -Sending unkind messages or comments.
- -Sharing images or videos of someone without their permission.
- -Excluding someone from a group chat or other online activity like gaming.
- -Pressuring another person to say or do something that makes them feel uncomfortable.
- -Setting up groups or accounts to encourage others to be mean to someone else.

Childline have some valuable information to help your child recognise and deal with cyberbullying. We also have advice for parents and carers to help keep children safe from bullying, wherever it happens.
